Subjects

Elizabeth College provides a rich and wide ranging curriculum to prepare students for university studies, further technical education and employment. The range of learning areas includes Humanities, Mathematics, Science, English, and the Arts.

Elective Subjects

Students in years 11 and 12 are able to select subjects from a wide range of course areas. Subjects are accredited by the Tasmanian Assessment, Standards & Certification) and are offered at both a university-entrance level (level 3), or at a foundation level (level 2).

Elizabeth College also provides a wide range of nationally-recognised vocational (VET) programs for students wishing to pursue further studies at a training institution such as TasTAFE.

Student Support

International Student Advisors

International students are supported by the school's two International Student Advisors (ISA), one who speaks fluent Chinese, and the other who speaks fluent Japanese (pictured above, with an international student). The ISAs will help students settle into the school environment, assist with any concerns, talk with students about their study pathway, and help students locate career information.

English Language Support

English as an Additional Language (EAL) support and individual assistance is provided by EAL teachers, counsellors, and other staff. Special activities are arranged so that students can learn about Tasmania and also about Australian culture.

Counsellors

Student support is provided by the school's student counsellors, careers counsellors, youth worker, and psychologist.
