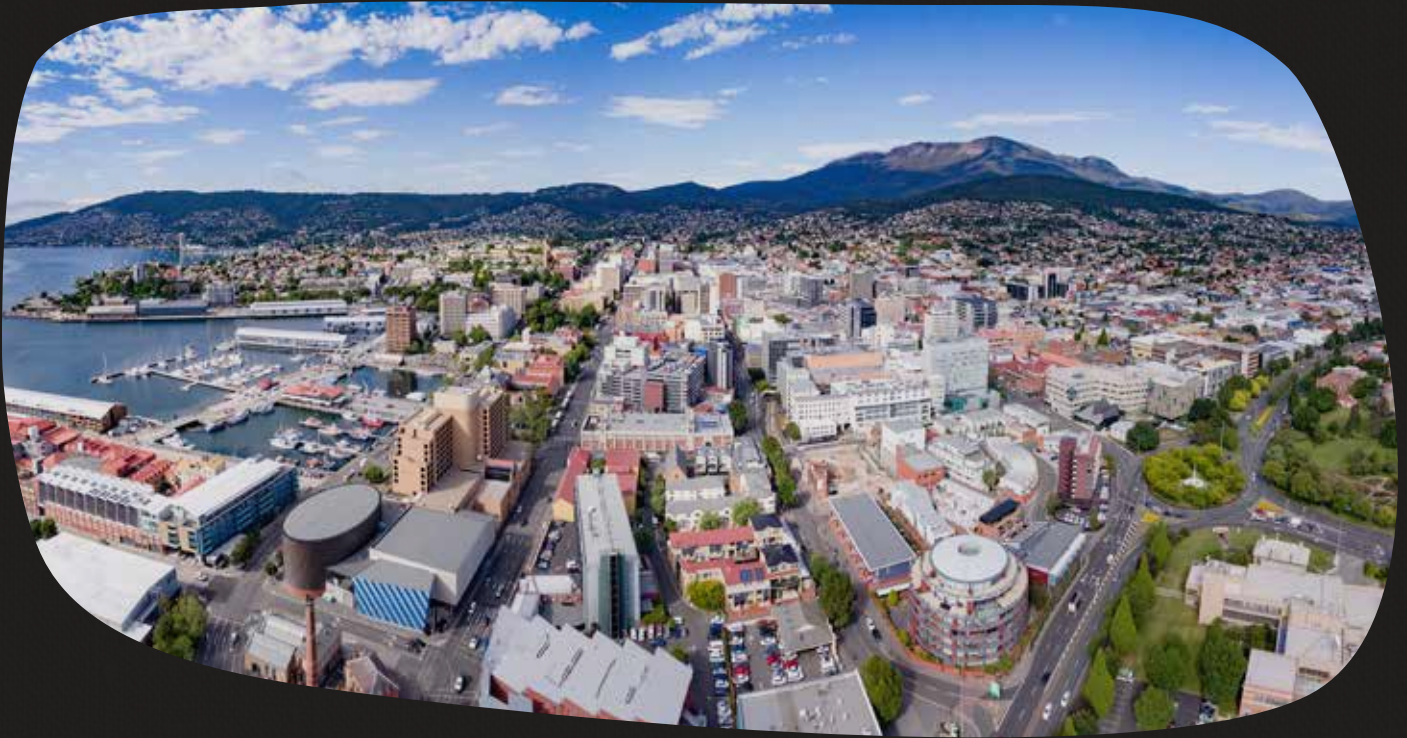
4. Government owned and operated

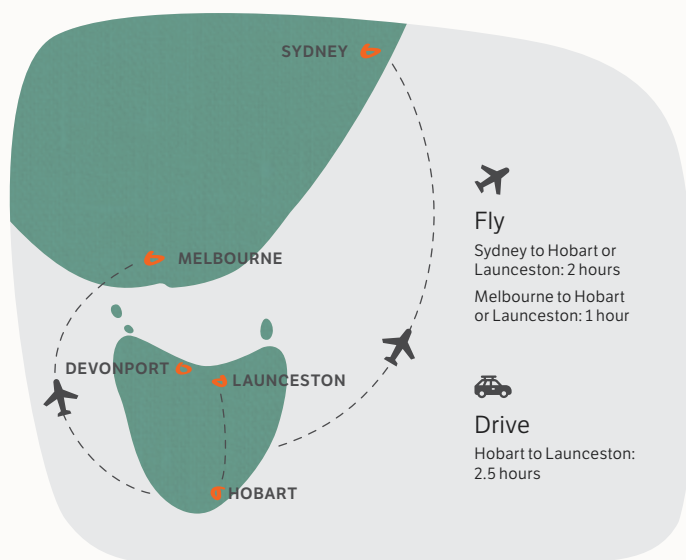
